I understood how my grades were determined in this course.





the class was a difficult topic


I really enjoyed this course. I liked the content and thought it was taught well however it was a little difficult for being an intro ethics class.

He was a good professor but when we would ask questions he didn't really understand what we were asking and couldn't really explain the material to us.


Joonho was a great lecturer. He cared about the subjects he was teaching, and made sure we were clear on the information presented before moving on.

He is a good professor. He allows his students to learn in a quick and fashionable way



Which of these contributed to your answer?






There were so many things that were unclear in this course, not to mention that his notes were very confusing.
